pastor's column



Well here we are having made it through another blessed Christmas Season of our Christian Church which ended on Epiphany Sunday (Three Kings Sunday) January 3, 2016.

And now we are in the Season after the Epiphany in what the church calls Ordinary Time. The First Sunday focuses on the Baptism of Christ (January 10) and the Last Sunday on the Transfiguration (February 7).

This season includes four to nine Sundays depending on the date of Easter. We will be celebrating four this year, ending on February 7, Transfiguration Sunday. And then we start the Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on February 10.

Remember what we said about Ordinary Time? After each cycle, (the Christian year contains two cycles; The Christmas Cycle and the Easter Cycle), there is an "ordinary time" of growth symbolized by the color green.

During the Epiphany season, the manifestation of Christ increasingly unfolds. The Magi follow the star to the Christ Child; Jesus is baptized and receives affirmation of his Messiahship from his Father; He proclaims the gospel, and finally His Transfiguration is completed.

Our travels take us now into the Lenten Season. A season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 10, and ends on Holy Saturday, March 26.

Okay then, now you have your itinerary all set for the next three months. We will be making some stops along the way, (Ash Wednesday February 10th, Palm Sunday March

20th & Good Friday March 25th) and I am looking forward to having you along for the journey. Grace & Peace,
